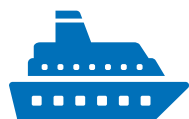

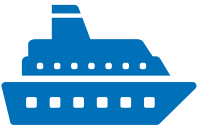

What's the weather like in Rome in March?

In March, Rome transitions from winter to spring. The weather begins to warm up, making it a pleasant time to visit the city. However, it is still advisable to pack warm clothing, as the evenings can be chilly. The days become longer, with an average of 10 hours of daylight, providing ample time to explore the city's attractions.

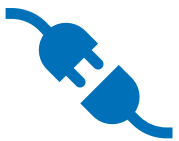
Average daily temperatures

The average daily temperature in Rome in March ranges from 8°C (46°F) to 16°C (61°F). The beginning of the month tends to be cooler, while towards the end, temperatures start to rise. It is recommended to wear layers during this time as the mornings and evenings can still be quite chilly, while the afternoons are more comfortable. It is also advisable to bring a light jacket or sweater for the cooler periods.

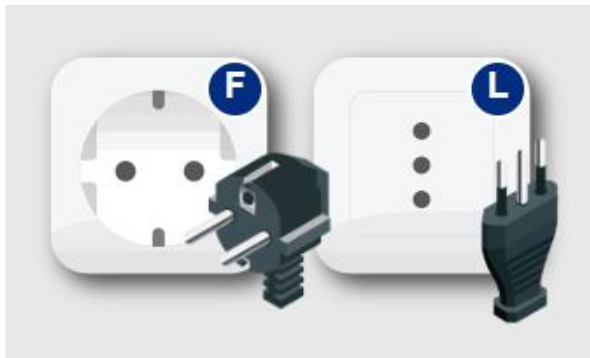
Kit List



The currency is the **Euro** and it is easy to buy in the UK from all of the usual outlets. We recommend that students buy their currency in advance. **Credit/debit cards** are widely accepted but cash is the preferred option. Students will also need the € 40 Euro for deposits at the hotels which should be returned if no damage is caused in rooms.



The supply voltage is 230V and they use the **F and L type**, which has **two or three round pins**.



Don't forget your passport...

Your passport must be:

Issued less than 10 years before the date you enter the country

Valid for at least 3 months after the day you plan to leave

GHIC CARDS

It is advised for everyone to apply for a GHIC Card, for use in the EU. Many state hospitals and doctors will accept this if a member of the group seeks medical assistance.

A member of staff will keep passports safe upon student's arrival for the start of the trip.



Global Health Insurance Card (ghic)

You **can** use a GHIC and a EHIC card in Italy – apply at <https://overseas-healthcare.nhsbsa.nhs.uk/get-healthcare-cover-travelling-abroad/start>



Important

There is no deadline to apply for a UK Global Health Insurance Card or a UK European Health Insurance Card. If you have an existing European Health Insurance Card, you can continue to use it until it expires.

Luggage

- 1 item of **small under seat cabin bag** measuring no more than **40cm x 30cm x 15cm** 1 item of **cabin luggage** (max. 56 x 45 x 25cm) weighing no more than **10kg per person** There is a charge for exceeding this
- No liquids in hand luggage but bring an empty water bottle to refill once through. Fresh water is widely available throughout Rome on tap and also some in Naples, so a bottle is essential.
- Electrical equipment – at your own risk – different plug
- Money will be required for students to buy drinks and lunchtime meals. We advise you to take €100 to €150 Euro,
- Optional – Monzo or Revolut Card for kids with pre-loaded money. Many places accept card payment.

IMPORTANT:

Since much of your time will be out in the field, we recommend function rather than fashion!

Particularly if the group is doing walks / hikes, we recommend layers of clothes as there can be considerable changes in temperature between the foot of the mountain and the top.

To help keep to the airline weight limitations it is acceptable for you to wear walking/hiking boots for the journey.

And, lastly... **DON'T FORGET YOUR PASSPORT!**

Personal Items and safety in a city

- Unfortunately pick pockets are likely to be present in some of the locations we visit in both Rome and Naples.
- To avoid pickpockets in Italy, keep valuables in front pockets or a secured crossbody bag worn in front, never in back pockets or loose bags. Carry minimal cash and stay vigilant in crowded areas like metro stations, buses, and popular tourist spots. We must try to be aware of distraction tactics.
- We will utilize hotel safes for passports.



Behaviour whilst away:

- Our expectations are exactly the same as if you were at school... Be on time for meet times
- When on excursions following the health and safety rules of any venue visited and follow the instructions of the venue staff/activity leaders/tour leaders
- Behave appropriately at all times – you are representing the school
- Treat others how you wish to be treated yourself
- No smoking/vaping/drinking (or purchase of such items as per behaviour contract)
- Follow our rules: stay in groups/don't leave the hotel
- In your rooms when told – 10pm in rooms/Lights out 10.30pm
- The code of conduct section of the consent form agreed to the above.
- The trip schedule is tight – so students will be expected to be up and ready for a full day every day. Sleeping on coach between visits.
