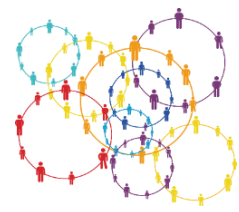




Sociology

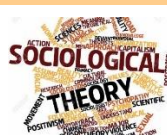
Students look at how the topics they are studying in class refer to real world events and examples. These can be used within essays to support the points made.
