On the 2nd March, ten students from Year 12 visited Pembroke College, Cambridge University for an Oxbridge outreach day. This was an incredible

The Q and A sessions gained us all a better understanding of the processes involved and inspired us to be ambitious for the competitive applications. We were guided by Tom (a current student) around Pembroke College, which is one of the prestigious 31 colleges on offer at Cambridge University. We were exposed to the wealth of opportunities available at Pembroke College, including the supervision in the tutorial system which greatly benefits the academic support available to the students attending the college. We also had the bonus of a free lunch which was very

generous and tasty. This was an incredible event that we were provided with, so we are all very grateful to Miss Hunt for organising it and Mrs Stuart for accompanying us.

Are you using the Go4Schools App? If not, download it via Google Play or Apple Store, log in with the same login you use online and see what it offers:

Behaviour:

Continue to scroll down the app to the Behaviour information. This will display a bar chart of both negative and positive behaviour points over time, the chart can be scrolled across throughout the year. Positive points are shown in green and negative points in red with a total points count.



Behaviour detail: If you tap the 'details' button or tap in the white space around the behaviour chart you can then view the detailed event record for your child including the date, the subject, the event type and the associated points.

This is useful to see if positive or negative behaviour are occurring in certain lessons.
