Reading at Guilsborough

At Guilsborough, why do we place such an emphasis on the importance of reading? Reading is mentally stimulating, it enables us to acquire knowledge, decreases stress, widens vocabulary, and develops analytical skills. Therefore, we are always trying to promote reading in many different creative and inspiring ways. Here are a few examples.

Guided Reading.

Each week all students are engaging in a guided reading session, during tutor time. They will be working through a booklet, with Tutors and peers, which will promote a wide variety of activities. This will include reading extracts, discussing thought provoking questions, learning new vocabulary and much more.

Guilsborough's Library.

The library is a busy and an inviting place. It is open every day, during break and lunch time, for all year groups. Students benefit from the knowledgeable and helpful staff as they select books and get help with homework. There are a wide variety of board games available from Battleships, Connect 4 and the ever popular Uno. Everyone enjoys assisting with the 1000-piece jigsaw and there is great triumph when it is completed.

On Thursdays we encourage a quiet reading environment and on Fridays there is the competitive chess club. Students of all years gather to see who can check-mate in the least number of moves. Recently we have been able to modernise the library with several pieces of stylish comfy seating and lots of new fiction books.

Reading Buddies

A group of Year 7 students come to the library on a Wednesday and Friday, during tutor time. They are paired up with a Year 10 student who will be their 'book buddy'. The Year 10 students encourage them in their reading by talking about their book and listening to them read. It really is a delight to see students working so well together to promote reading.

On Thursday mornings we have also been running this scheme with the Year 8 and 12 students. In their last reading assessment, we have seen a 64% increase in their reading ages from these students who attend the scheme. We really appreciate the level of commitment and enthusiasm shown by pupils involved.





Their skills in textiles led them to creating a corset each, building up their techniques and learning about shape & structure.


















Product Design


