- Good attendance leads to good outcomes

Attendance (%)	Outcomes compared to their peers
95+ (50% of our students)	Half a grade higher in each subject
90 – 95 (29% of our students)	Equal grades
85 – 90 (5% of our students)	Half a grade lower in each subject
80 – 85 (7% of our students)	Three quarters of a grade lower in each subject
Less than 80 (8% of our students)	One and a half grades lower in each subject

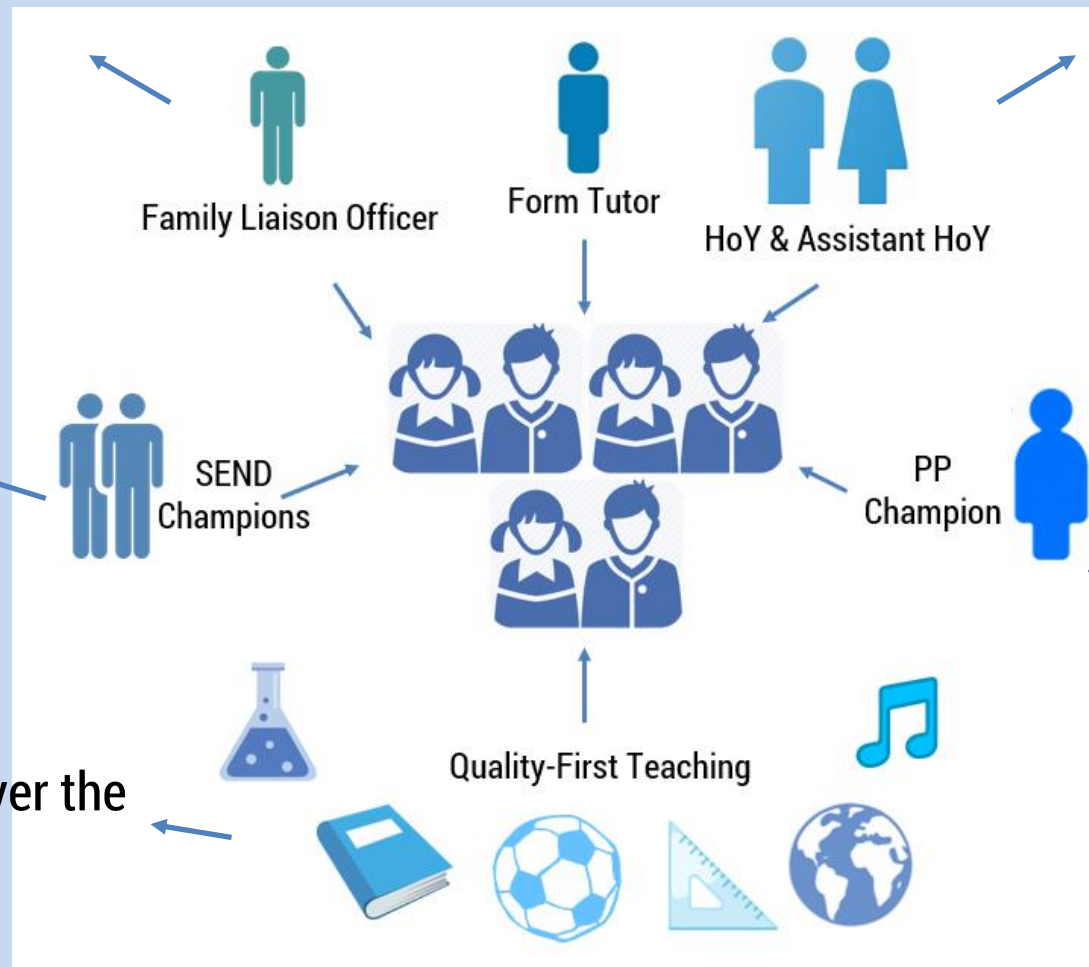

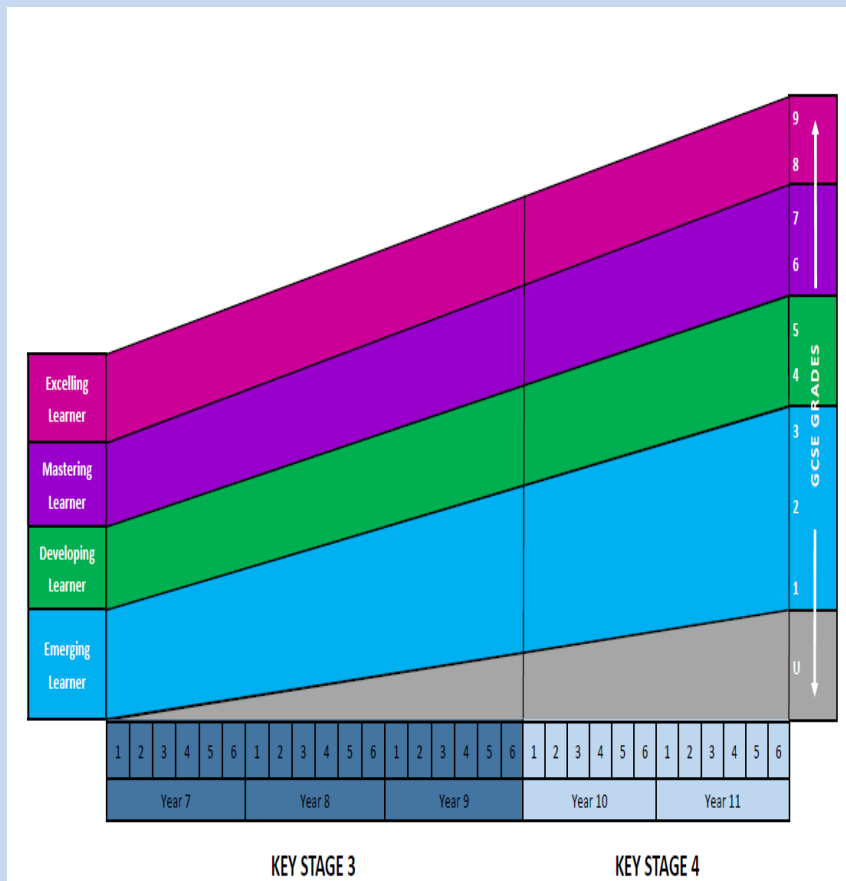

Pathways

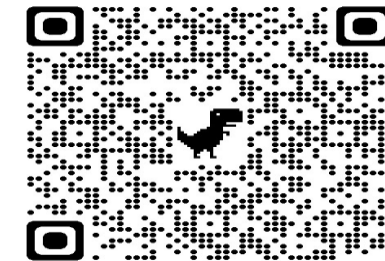


- Students are put into one of four pathways: Emerging, Developing, Mastering and Excelling

- Year 7 will sit CATS tests in September and GL Assessments in English and Maths
- Our aim is to share as much of the students test data as possible

CATS and GL Assessments

- CATS take place in computer rooms during the week beginning September 25th
- They are used to assess children's abilities to think in particular ways including understanding, memory, reasoning and decision making.
- GL Assessments will also take place in computer rooms during the week beginning May 6th
- They are used to measure progress in English, Maths and Science
- They are taken by over 45000 students across the country and have been externally validated
- They also identify individual gaps in understanding which supports interventions
- Results will be issued shortly after the exams have been taken

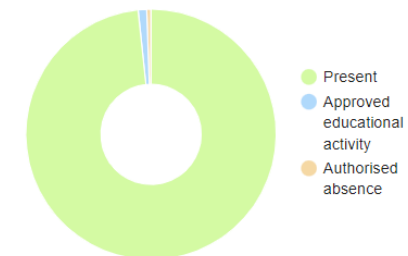

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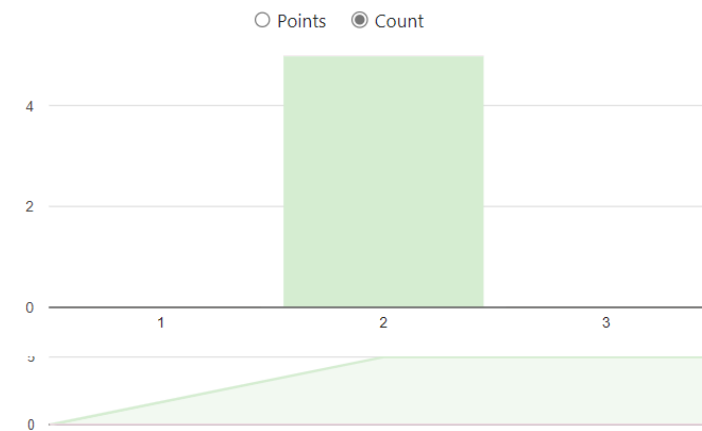

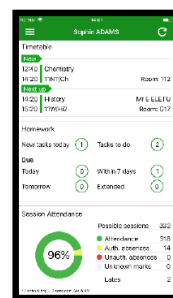


The App

If you are a first-time user, you will need to log into the website first to receive your password.



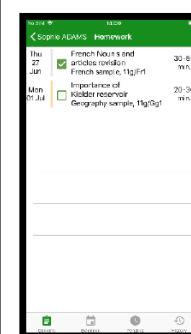

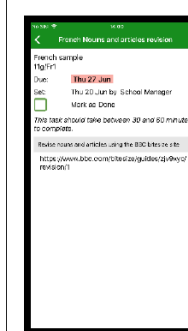
Homework overview:

Tap on the specific homework you wish to view.

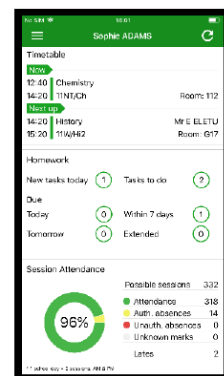


Homework detail:

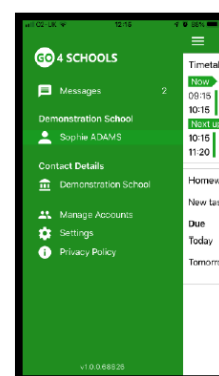

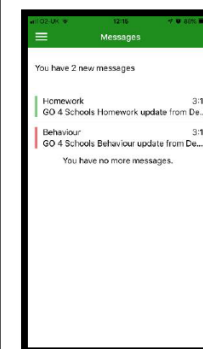
Tap on the menu in the top-left corner to access messages and settings.



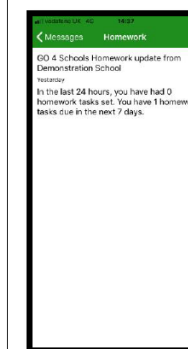
Messages from your school and your settings can be accessed from this menu.



In the **message inbox** tap on the message for more detail. Your messages will be organised by date order and titled by areas such as Homework, Behaviour and Detention notifications.

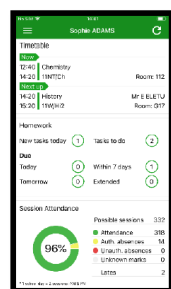

Here is an example of how a message might look. Tap back on messages and then your child's name to return to the main screen.





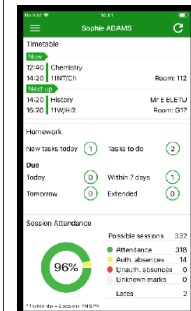
Timetable:
From the main screen you can also tap on the timetable for more information.



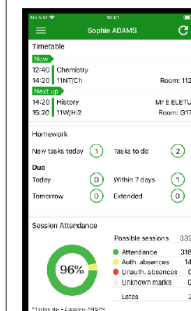
Timetable detail:
You are then presented with today's timetable. You can tap or swipe to previous and future days at the top.



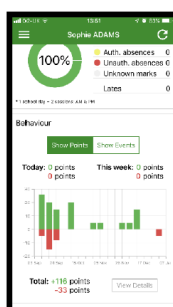
Attendance:
From the main screen scroll down to view attendance information. A chart displays the overall percentage attendance.



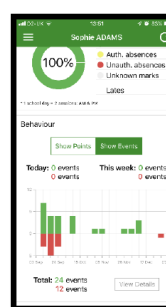
The App will also display detail about specific attendance marks including authorised and unauthorised attendance marks. Late marks are incorporated into the overall attendance marks and unknown marks are waiting for confirmation of the reason for the absence.
NOTE: There are two possible sessions in a school day, AM and PM.



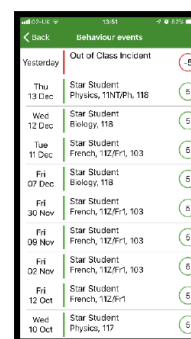
Behaviour:
Continue to scroll down the app to the Behaviour information. This will display a bar chart of both negative and positive behaviour points over time, the chart can be scrolled across throughout the year. Positive points are shown in green and negative points in red with a total points count.



If you prefer you can toggle the graph to show the number of events rather than points. This will allow you to see the number of positive and negative events recorded over time. Again, you can scroll the chart across and positive events are in green and negative events in red.

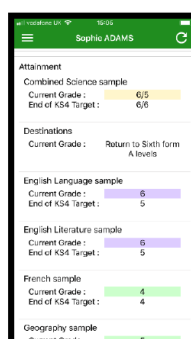


Behaviour detail:
If you tap the 'details' button or tap in the white space around the behaviour chart you can then view the detailed event record for your child including the date, the subject, the event type and the associated points.

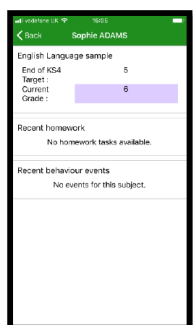


This is useful to see if positive or negative behaviour are occurring in certain lessons.

Attainment:
Scrolling down further, you can see the attainment card, showing how your child is doing in their subjects. The attainment card at the top level provides their grades, and their residual (how well they are doing when compared to their target), if shared by their school.

If you tap on a specific subject you can see an overview of attainment, behaviour and homework for that subject

What is safeguarding?

Keeping you safe and healthy at school and at home.

Making sure that you feel safe in your environment and are protected from harm from both adults and other young people.

Educating you to know how to keep yourself safe.

Who is available to help?

At school you can talk to:

- Your Tutor/Head of Year/ Learning Mentor/ Any trusted adult, e.g., Teacher, Teaching Assistant, non-teaching staff

- Trusted Family Member, trusted adult such as sports coach or Friends
- Your Family Doctor

- The Police

Where can I go?

In school you can go to:

- Head of Year Office
- A subject Teacher

Outside of school:

- The school website
- Online Support websites

How will you keep me safe?

- We will educate you to ensure a strong culture of diversity and inclusivity where difference is celebrated positively.
- We will educate you to keep yourself mentally and physically healthy.
- We will educate you to stay safe online and out in the community.
- All Guldborg Academy staff are trained to spot the signs of abuse or neglect.
- Staff are trained to deal with incidents of abuse from adults to children and abuse which can occur between young people.
- We will always listen and act upon your concerns. This may involve working with your parents or carers or getting help from other services outside of school.
- Your wishes and feelings will always be considered.

Why is it important?

From time to time, children can suffer abuse from adults and other young people. Abuse can be physically, sexually, or emotionally harmful or neglectful and can happen in person or online, at home, within the community or in school. We want to make sure that everyone at Guldborg Academy is protected from abuse and harm.

When can I speak to someone?

- You or a family member can talk to a member of staff at any time about a worry or a concern that you may have about yourself or a friend.

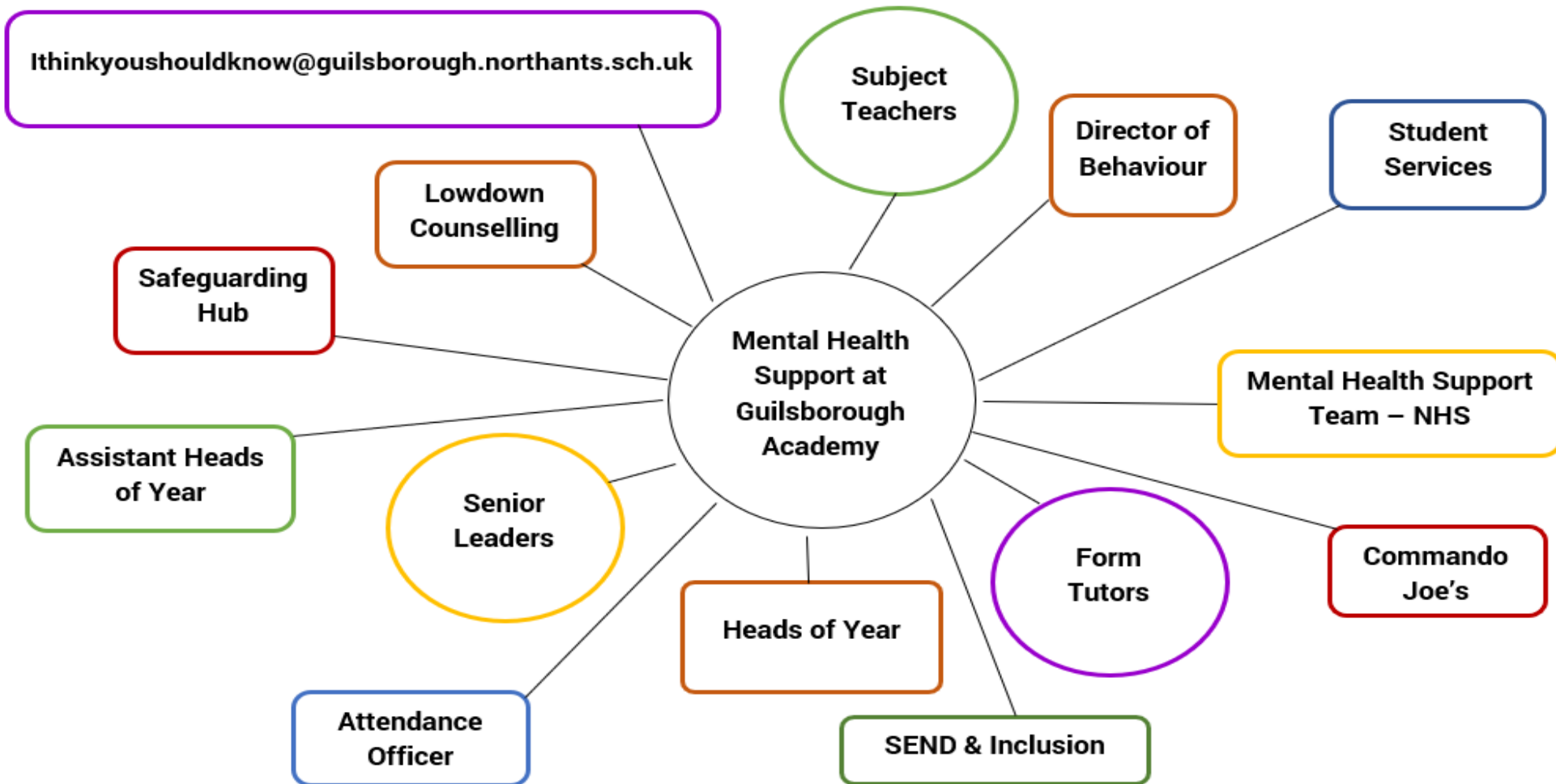
