Dear Parents/Carers,

This week we have been celebrating the one-year anniversary of the launch of Rail Safe Friendly. Harrison's Story continues to be a powerful and poignant message. Over 4000 schools across the country, and over 70 companies, now engage with resources to teach children about the dangers on the railways and how they can keep themselves safe. We were proud to launch Rail Safe Friendly in March 2023, supported by Chris Heaton-Harris and Harrison's mother. As well as becoming the first school in the country to renew the Gold award, students from Year 10 and 11 joined with representatives from over 20 employers to discuss careers in their various companies.

On Wednesday we had a magnificent evening of music with our annual Live Lounge. Our musicians, supported by Mrs Holmes, were amazing and gave a number of moving performances. The confidence of our young people, performing to over 100 people is to be celebrated. At the end of the evening, the students had one extra performance. With Mrs Holmes leaving to take up a new post, they surprised her and performed her favourite song. We welcome Miss Billett who will be joining us before Mrs Holmes leaves to ensure an effective handover.



## Webinar for Educake - Science

Science use the platform Educake for homework - but this can also support with revision.

The webinar will take place on **Monday, 25th March at 6:00 PM**, and there will be a chance to ask questions.
This will allow you to engage with this to support your child as they prepare for exams.

### **LINK TO WEBINAR**



Good revision skills are needed for students in all Year groups of the Academy. Teachers are using Dual Coding in their lessons to support learning, and this is also an excellent skill to use when revising for in class assessments through to external examinations.

Form tutors will be going through this strategy with the students, as well as subject teachers using in class - but parents and carers also benefit from being able to support with how to revise effectively.

Each month will introduce a new strategy, building on the core strategies of **Retrieval Practice** (Low stakes assessment which is desirably difficult) and **Space/ Interleaving** (Scheduling past content and mixed material).


