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DEVELOPMENT PLANS - MONTHLY UPDATE - APRIL 2024

Leadership and Management

During the past month, Academy leaders have been continuing their work to ensure that all key vacancies have been filled. This is now the case. We welcome Mr Dickens (Head of ICT), Mr Francis (Co-Head of Year and Teacher of Maths) and Mrs Gretton (Assistant Director of English) to Guilsborough. Miss Billet has also joined the Academy and will be taking over from Mrs Holmes as Head of Music when she leaves at the end of the month. In addition, the Academy has restructured our Performing Arts faculty with Mr Jackson becoming our new Head of Performing Arts. I know there are already plans in place for school performances and increased opportunities for students to participate in the Arts.

The Academy has secured increased external support from a trained Ofsted inspector who is working with leaders to ensure effective Quality Assurance of our work. They are working with us to identify further opportunities for development. This external validation of our work is crucial, giving confidence that we are taking positive actions.

Quality of Education

Since the last update, we have been carrying out learning walks in a variety of classes to see the impact of the different strategies that we have been focusing on in our training. Students are being asked about what they have been working on previously and how the lessons link together. Alongside this, students have been asked about topics from earlier in the year and also where these link to previous years. In many of our subjects, topics spiral from year to year increasing in depth and complexity and it is important for our students to understand how these develop. After the Easter break, we will be holding our final training session looking at strategies around the chunking of material, ensuring that the volume of information provided is manageable including different strategies for students with a variety of needs.

Following on from a number of emails from some of our parents, we are also revisiting our homework offer as there are a number of areas where insufficient homework is being set or the homework is not as challenging as perhaps it needs to be. Subject leaders met with their teams on Monday 18th March and reviewed this. Moving forward, homework should be set more frequently with some being consolidation work and some providing greater stretch and challenge.

Behaviour and Attitudes

We have been pleased with the positive student and parent/carer voice that we have received since launching the Wednesday Weekly Wheel, where students have the chance to win 3 x £10 Amazon vouchers for their conduct in the previous week. Specifically, 100% attendance, no negative points and ≥5 positive events. The student voice gathered has praised the reachable goals and the chance to aim for something new each week. Additionally, we are thrilled that 86% of Years 7-11 have achieved at least their Form Tutor award as part of the Academy's 'EmpowerED' rewards system. This is a real achievement and we look forward to the final three celebration assemblies of academic year where 'points mean prizes' and the chance to win an iPad Mini.

To support students to fulfil their potential and 'The Guilsborough Way', we are developing a system that monitors students' conduct (positive and negative behaviour, attendance and punctuality) on a fortnightly basis to inform interventions that support improvement. Specifically, levels of mentoring and SMART targets that will promote discussions between Form Tutors, students and parents/carers on how to maximise learning opportunities by upholding the Academy's standards. Further details will be shared in due course and will be delivered to students through Registration periods next term.

Personal Development

Throughout Term 5, 'The Guilsborough Way' has continued to develop areas within the overall culture and values of the academy. This has included students working on the language they use towards each other, understanding how such words and name calling can have a long term impact, and also participating in the 'show racism the red card' campaign. This was a national project aimed at raising awareness of racism and the negative impact this can have on society and in schools. Students were offered the opportunity to be creative and make posters, write songs or poetry and even designing football boots or clothing to highlight the importance of 'showing racism the red card'.

Our LGBTQ student voice group have also been working hard planning and leading whole year assemblies and they will also be leading staff training in Term 6 to highlight our values, inclusion and equality at the academy. We will also have an external visitor in from In2People, in Term 6. In2People visit schools and talk about current topics which are affecting young people, their presentations will focus on anti-racism, respect and diversity.





On the 13th March, along with one of my A-Level History classmates, I was lucky enough to get the opportunity to visit Auschwitz-Birkenau in Poland. We arrived at the airport at 4:30am and were back at 11:30pm so to say it was a whirl wind trip would be an understatement but yet it proved to be a day I would never forget.

Auschwitz itself was overwhelming and confronting and seeing the sheer size of Birkenau was equally shocking but it was hearing the testaments and seeing the photos of people who were taken to the Camp, that was arguably the most important part of the trip. We also got to hear a talk from a Holocaust survivor named Janine who told us her own story which was a true privilege.

I have written a poem which hopefully expresses a little of what it was like visiting Auschwitz.

I wrote it thinking about a tiny pair of pink dungarees that were on display and how it made me feel.


