

Educational Visit Update

On Monday 18 September, we went to London on a trip for our GCSE history course. We arrived in London at around 10:30am and walked to the Golden Hinde. This was the site we had to visit for our study on Elizabeth 1 for our question 4 on our GCSE paper. We first had a talk about where Sir Francis Drake went on his journey around the world, and what happened in terms of the wealth and types of goods he and his crew obtained. We then were taken on a tour around the ship and were told about what life would have been like on one of the voyages, for the several types/classes of people in the crew – as well as the jobs that they would have had to do. We found this visual representation very interesting and eye-opening as it gave us a deeper insight into Elizabethan life aboard the ship.

After our tour of the Golden Hinde, we stopped for lunch before heading to our second destination – the old medicine museum and 19th Century operating theatre. We first sat for a talk about what surgery would have been like at the time. This included what tools a surgeon would have used, how long surgery would have taken (did you know, the most skilled surgeons could perform a successful amputation in under one minute?), levels of severity regarding infection – and how this was combatted after new discoveries such as anaesthetics and antiseptics. This was valuable to our learning of Medicine Through Time, as we were able to view what we had learned

from the perspective of someone at the time. After the talk, we walked around the medicine museum, which had tools, remedies, and texts containing the knowledge held at the time. Something we personally found interesting was how they attempted complex eye surgeries with limited tools, and the real organ and skeleton specimens that they had. Overall, it was a brilliant experience. Thank you to Mr Rogers and the History Department for putting together such an amazing day.


