



Guilsborough Academy Summer School 2021

Guilsborough Academy held an exciting programme of activities for Year 6 and Year 7 students over 10 days during July 2021. The Department for Education (DfE) made funding available for secondary schools to provide students starting school in September 2021 with comprehensive support in areas identified as having been impacted by a loss of learning, during school closures.

Guilsborough Academy summer school was delivered in accordance with the guidance and conditions of funding for schools and local authorities. The funding was used for the purpose for which it was provided, and in accordance with the conditions of funding, a blend of academic and enrichment activity was provided.

Guilsborough Academy retained evidence in relation to the requirements laid down by the DfE, including daily registers and reasons for non-attendance, receipted records of summer school costs including unrecoverable costs.

The programme included targeted literacy and maths support, as well as outdoor pursuits, team games, fitness and well-being activities, arts and crafts, performing arts, and other focused enrichment and pastoral activities.

Summary of how the DfE funding was used Places offered and taken

200 students were offered a place. 23 of those offered a place were designated as pupil premium students, with 177 students offered a place designated as non-pupil premium.

In total, 159 students took up the offer of a place at the summer school. Of those, 21 were designated as pupil premium and 138 students were designated as non-pupil premium.

Unfortunately some students were unable to attend at the last minute due to illness but where possible these places were offered to other students.
