Straight after the Easter break we will be expecting all our students to attend lessons with the equipment they require for learning, and will be challenging them when this is not the case. A full list of the necessary equipment is listed on our website and is copied here:

- Black pens (x2)
- Pencil
- Ruler (preferably 30cm)
- Calculator (the academy recommends a Scientific Calculator (Casio fx-83GTX )
- Pencil sharpener
- Rubber
- Reading book for years 7-9

In addition, the following are also advised:

- · Maths set including protractor and a pair of compasses
- Highlighters

We would like all students to keep their equipment in a pencil case. This will help them to keep their equipment organised and prevent it from being lost or broken.
